When Betty and Judy travel to a Vermont lodge to perform a Christmas show, Wallace and Davis follow, only to find their former commander, General Waverly, is the lodge owner. "Made In Dagenham" was one of 2010's home-made gems. This is a lively and delightfully performed film about the real-life story of a group of female factory workers in 1968 at the Ford plant in Dagenham and their struggle for equal pay. (113 Minutes)



SEVEN BRIDES FOR SEVEN BROTHERS (1954)

Director: Stanley Donen

Starring: Howard Keel, Jane Powell and Jeff Richards

This is an exuberant, 1950's musical masterpiece which was a sensational commercial success in its day and is as fresh as it was 60 years ago. Sit down, relax and tap your feet to the well known songs: "Wonderful, Wonderful Day", "Bless Your Beautiful Hide" and "When you're in Love". (102 Minutes)



GRAN TORINO (2009)

Wednesday 9th March 2011

Director: Clint Eastwood

Starring: Clint Eastwood, Christopher Carley and Bee Vang.

Clint Eastwood plays an embittered racist who learns to respect his young immigrant neighbours and finds redemption for his past sins during the Korean War. This strong drama with moments of black humour, is Eastwood's 30th film as Director (but no orang-utans this time!) and which he has confirmed as his last acting performance. (116 Minutes)



CHOCOLAT (2001)

Director: Lasse Hallstrom

Starring: Juliette Binoche, Judi Dench, Alfred Molina and Johnny Depp.

In a small French village where life has been the same for many years, a war is about to break out between the tranquillity of tradition and the fear of change when a single mother and her six year old daughter open up a chocolate shop opposite the village church. The film becomes a moving exploration of tolerance and personal liberation, beautifully shot and acted. (121 Minutes)



AS GOOD AS IT GETS (1997)

Starring: Jack Nicholson, Helen Hunt and Greg Kinnear



"As Good As It Gets" is one of the sharpest Hollywood comedies of the 1990's. Jack Nicholson plays an obsessive-compulsive curmudgeon who improves his personality at the urging of his gay neighbour (Greg Kinnear) and a waitress (Helen Hunt). This is a superior romantic comedy that builds on

a witty script and smart cast and which won Best Actor and Best Actress awards for Nicholson and Hunt. (133 Minutes)

REAR WINDOW (1954)

Director: Alfred Hitchcock

Starring: James Stewart, Grace Kelly and Wendell Corey

This film is considered by many filmgoers and critics to be one of Hitchcock's best. Professional photographer L.B. "Jeff" Jeffries, played by James Stewart, breaks his leg. Confined to his New York apartment, he spends his time looking out of the rear window observing the neighbours. He begins to suspect that a man across the courtyard may have murdered his wife... (112 Minutes)



WITNESS (1985)

Director: Peter Weir

Starring: Harrison Ford and Kelly McGillis



Witness proves that the 1980's was just as much a decade of thoughtful films as any other. Harrison Ford, in a break from blockbuster stardom, plays John Book, a hardened but decent and honest Philadelphia detective. A young Amish boy (Luke Haas) is the only witness to a murder at a railway station and Book is the investigating officer. This is a great and unusual story crafted by a superb director. (112 Minutes)

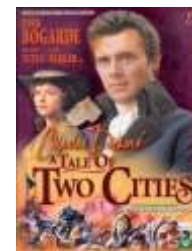
TALE OF TWO CITIES (1958)
